To Families, Residents and Visitors,

I wanted to provide a visitation update with respect to the most recent Emergency Order (DEM Order No. 20-011) and some guidance regarding the upcoming holiday season.

Visitors may continue to schedule their visits by contacting the receptionist via the main number. We will continue following our two visitations per week schedule for 30 minutes at a time. Residents are no longer restricted to only five (5) designated visitors. Each resident may have two (2) visitors at one time. Visitors will continue to be required to wear a mask and practice social distancing during their entire visit.

In accordance with the Emergency Order, Solaris is allowing limited in facility visitation which meets the guidelines of the order for certain compassionate care and/or hospice situations. Any individual entering the facility will be screened according to CDC guidelines, use appropriate PPE while in the facility, and avoid any contact within six (6) feet of any other resident and/or staff member.

As I am sure you are aware, the positivity rate for COVID-19 is rising throughout Collier County, the State of Florida, and the nation. Solaris strongly encourages family members to refrain from taking their loved ones out of the facility for the holidays to reduce their risk of exposure and the risk of exposure to other residents and staff. Should you decide to take your loved one out of the facility to attend a holiday function, Solaris requests that all residents and families practice mask and eye protection use and social distancing while off the property. As difficult as it may be, no physical contact should occur.

All residents must be screened upon return to the facility. In addition to routine screening criteria for temperature and symptoms, screening will assess the potential exposure to COVID-19 such as contact with anyone who was symptomatic, attendance at large gatherings and adherence to social distancing and



PPE use. If upon return, the resident does not pass screening criteria, residents will be quarantined or isolated based on their circumstances consistent with CDC guidelines.

Solaris has been successful in keeping our residents free from COVID-19 since July because of diligent efforts by staff, residents, and family members. We will be able to continue visitation if there are no resident or staff cases. Your continued efforts to practice safe habits will allow us to keep he virus out of the center.

Solaris understands that the pandemic has caused a lot of stress and strain on you and your loved ones. Your continued support and cooperation are appreciated.
